### 9. Annual Reports from DIRA committees

Community Dock: Increased moorage this year due to installation of 2 buoys for community rent. The Committee received 50% of investment back in this first year. There are a few problems with users not paying their moorage fees. Any suggestions for dealing with this would be appreciated. A draft of the camera policy has been provided for the Executive's consideration. The cameras focus solely on the lease property. Looking at the idea of a warfinger but the expense is a consideration.

<u>Parks:</u> Very active and happy group with 7 to 11 members plus CVRD Parks staff attend monthly meetings. The provincial process is glacial with the management plan, as in there is still not one in place. Once there is one in place then more funds can be allocated. Every Park entrance is now signed

All of the CVRD parks are in good shape. A map detailing the trails in the North end is located at the Railway March kiosk.
