NEW BUSINESS:

A quote was received from Comox Rentals and Recreation, formally Western-One, to purchase some more tools to help us clear trails. The list includes:

- A nut, washer and plate to convert the weed eater head over to a blade.
- A weed eater attachment to fit our Kombi motors
- A blower to fit our Kombi motors.
- Two grass cutting blades.
- Three chisel blades for brush cutting.

The quote comes to \$467.45 including taxes.

A motion to purchase the tools listed up to an amount of \$500.00 was unanimously passed. Allan will ask Doug Wright to cut a cheque for the total amount. Then any member going to Courtenay can purchase the items at Comox Rentals and Recreation.

An approximately 8 km. hike to Nymph Falls was proposed for sometime around the 27th September. Ralph will arrange an exact time and advise everybody by e-mail.

A donation was received from Baynes Sound Insurance of \$100.00. Allan delivered Thank You notes to both Baynes Sound Insurance and Re/Max for their donations.
